

Bubble Blowers : Pie Bird Whistles

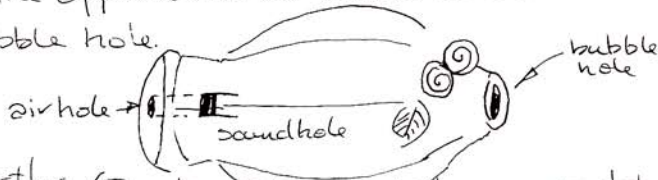
Bubble Blowers (Whistles which can be used to blow a soap bubble as well as whistle)

- choose a whistle form which has 2 ends; one end for the mouthpiece, the other end for dipping in soap solution and exuding bubbles

1. Proceed as Clay Whistle:

- Make 2 pinch bowls; attach together at rims; put on extra clay at back end to form a mouthpiece. Then cut sound hole and air holes

2. Once the whistle works make a single large finger hole on the opposite end of the air hole. This becomes the bubble hole.



Pie Bird Whistles (Pie decorations which have meant to collect juice and whistle when steam comes up from the bottom)

1. Make 4 pinch bowls - 2 larger bowls (for bottom juice collection) and 2 smaller bowls (whistle top section)
2. Attach Smaller Bowl on top of Larger Bowl with a coil of clay
3. Flatten Larger Bowl, add decorative elements.
4. Cut open the base of the bottom section & smooth
5. Cut sound hole on top - exactly at juncture between sections.
6. Using the needle tool cut air path between sections so air stream is aimed at the sharp edge or roof peak.
