

# Slab Whistles

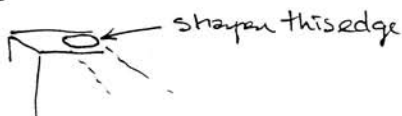
Derived from Stone Whistles

1. Roll out a sheet of clay about  $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick.
2. Impress with decorative stamp.
3. Cut out individual slabs. Bevel edges,



cut key chain hole

4. Let slabs dry to leather hard or cheddar cheese hard.
5. On bottom left corner. Turn slab upside down with drill bit cut, at about  $45^\circ$  angle (away from corner) a 1-2 cm hole



6. With a needle tool cut an air hole on the side of the slab, bottom left corner. The airstream should aim for the "sharpened edge" of the hole cut by the drill bit.
